

Naming School Building Sites, Facilities, or Spaces

Names given to new, expanded, or substantially remodeled District building sites, facilities, or spaces (“facilities”) should have special significance to the community, its traditions and values, as well as to the school’s student body. Ordinarily, a building will not be renamed unless its present name becomes inappropriate because of the changing nature of the community it serves or the programs it houses.

The Board may consider requests to name or rename facilities from community and school groups. The Board may decide to appoint an ad hoc committee of three Board members to hold hearings on a request to name or rename a facility. The committee will take into account the traditions and programs of the facility, the contributions of the person or entity to be honored, the traditions of names already in use, the long-range impact of any name change, the intended future use of the facility, and such other factors as the committee may deem relevant.

Upon the receipt of a recommendation of at least two alternatives, the Board will select a name for the facility.
