

Course Name: Community Functioning

Course Description: This is a one-year, two-credit course designed to prepare students to access and use community environments as independently as possible. This will allow students to participate in a variety of community activities that are utilized by all community members.

Course Expectations/Activities:

Students will:

- Interpret maps of the city, state and nation
- Read or identify community signs and safety words
- Demonstrate use of money for minor purchases
- Familiarize themselves with utility and service agencies
- Identify important people of city, state and nation
- Ordering food from a menu

Course Materials:

Students are allowed to bring wallet/purse with \$5(optional) for community outings (planning for Thursdays), and student ID to class everyday.

Evaluation:

The number of points from daily work, community outings, class projects and participation (bringing materials to class, being actively involved in class activities) will determine grade.

Attendance:

Behavior Expectations:

Classroom Rules:

3. No food and only clear liquids are allowed in a clear container (unless approved by teacher).

Interventions and consequences for not following these expectations could include a meeting with the teacher, a parent phone call, documentation of behavior, a 'lunch detention,' being sent to the AP's office with a written referral or a possible suspension. Students are expected to follow the Dubuque Community School District Student Behavior Policy 5200 found in the Parent-Student Handbook handed out at registration.

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
